There has been so much to highlight around school over the last couple of weeks.

Fiafia night was a great success with our Pasifika group really shining out. A big thank you to everyone who helped make this night so successful and a big thank you to Sister Monika for all the time she put into getting our Cultural group ready.

We would like to continue to grow our Pasifika group so if you have some ideas about how we could do this please come and see me.

All the children have done some basic first aid work with St John's, with everyone receiving a certificate.

We have started a Kapa Haka group with Whaea Tania leading them. At present we are starting with the senior students and will open it up to the juniors early next term.

St Gregory the Great's feast day is September 3rd. He was a Pope from AD 590 to 604. He was the first pope who had been a monk previously as well

as a diplomat. He was also known as a highly competent administrator and is known for his work on the liturgy and reorganisation of the entire church. Gregory was the first to send Christian missionaries to Britain and under his papacy the Church grew in influence and power throughout Europe. Gregory also instituted a system of distributing food and alms to the poor of Rome. Each year the Catholic Bishops of New Zealand set aside a week in September for Social Justice Week, inviting us to reflect and take action on a current social justice issue. 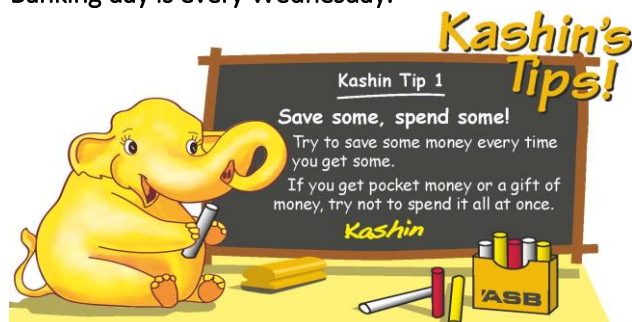
Please remind your children to wear their correct uniform to school everyday. That includes their school tie and school shoes.
